

Care & Cleaning

- Before you lift or reposition your monitor, it is better to disconnect the cables and power cord. Follow the correct lifting techniques when positioning the monitor. When lifting or carrying the monitor, grasp the edges of the monitor. Do not lift the display by the stand or the cord.
- Cleaning. Turn your monitor off and unplug the power cord. Clean the monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Stubborn stains may be removed with a cloth dampened with mild cleaner.
- Avoid using a cleaner containing alcohol or acetone. Use a cleaner intended for use with the monitor. Never spray cleaner directly on the screen, as it may drip inside the monitor and cause an electric shock.

The following symptoms are normal with the monitor:

- The screen may flicker during the initial use due to the nature of the fluorescent light. Turn off the Power Switch and turn it on again to make sure that the flicker disappears.
- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- When the same image is displayed for hours, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image. The screen will recover slowly or you can turn off the Power Switch for hours.
- When the screen becomes black or flashes, or cannot work anymore, contact your dealer or service center to fix it. Do not repair the screen by yourself!



1.3 Monitor introduction

1.3.1 Front view



1. QuickFit button:

- Activates the QuickFit function designed for alignment.
- The QuickFit function contains 7 pages of common grid patterns and paper and photo sizes. (Please refer to 1.3.3 QuickFit Function).

2. S / A button:

- Selects a desired preset mode.
- Exits the OSD menu or goes back to the previous menu when the OSD menu is active.
- Automatically adjusts the image to its optimized position, clock, and phase by pressing this button for 2-4 seconds (for VGA mode only).

3. **①**/▼

- Decreases values or moves your selection left/down.
- Contrast hotkey

4. MENU button:

- Turns on the OSD menu. Enacts the selected OSD menu item.
- Exits the hotkey OSD menu.

5. **\(\frac{1}{2}\)**

- Increases values or moves your selection right/up.
- Brightness hotkey
- 6. \rightarrow button:
 - Selects an available input source.




Press button (Input Select button) to display HDMI/DisplayPort signals after you connect HDMI/DisplayPort cable with the monitor.

- 7. U Power button/power indicator
 - Turns the monitor on/off.
 - The color definition of the power indicator is as the below table.

Rear connectors

- 1. **Power switch**. Press the switch to turn on/off power.
- 2. **AC-IN port**. This port connects the power cord.
- 3. **DisplayPort**. This port is for connection for a DisplayPort compatible device.
- 4. **HDMI port**. This port is for connection with an HDMI compatible device.

- DVI port. This 24-pin port is for PC (Personal Computer) DVI-D digital signal connection.
- 6. VGA port. This 15-pin port is for PC VGA connection.
- 7. Earphone jack.
- 8. **USB upstream port.** This port is for connection with a USB upstream cable. The cable enables the USB ports and card reader on the monitor.
- 9. Kensington lock slot.
- Card reader. See below for more information about the card reader specifications.
- 11. **USB downstream ports**. These ports are for connection with USB devices, such as USB keyboard/mouse, USB flash drive, etc.




1.3.3 QuickFit Function

The QuickFit function contains three kinds of patterns: (1) Grid patterns (2) Paper size (3) Photo size.

1. Grid patterns


The grid patterns facilitate designers and users to organize content and layout on a page and achieve a consistent look and feel.






2. Paper size

QuickFit provides numerous commonly used standard paper sizes for users to view their documents in real size on the screen.



3. Photo size

The various real photo sizes displayed in the QuickFit function provides photographers and other users to accurately view and edit their photos in real size on the screen.




2.1 Detaching the arm/base (for VESA wall mount)

The detachable arm/base of this monitor is specially designed for VESA wall mount.

To detach the arm/base:

- 1. Have the front of the monitor face down on a table.
- 2. Use a screwdriver to remove the four screws on the arm (Figure 1), and then detach the arm/base from the monitor (Figure 2).






We recommend that you cover the table surface with soft cloth to prevent damage to the monitor.


2.2 Adjusting the monitor

- For optimal viewing, we recommend that you look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.
- Hold the stand to prevent the monitor from falling when you change its angle.
- You can adjust the monitor's angle from +20° to -5° and it allows 60° swivel
 adjustment from either left or right. You can also adjust the monitor's height
 within +/- 10 cm.



Pivoting the monitor

- 1. Lift the monitor to the highest position.
- 2. Tilt the monitor to its maximum angle.
- 3. Pivot the monitor clockwise to the angle you need.




It is normal that the monitor slightly shakes while you adjust the viewing angle.

2.3 Connecting the cables

1. Connect the cables as the following instructions:



- To connect the power cord: connect one end of the power cord securely to the monitor's AC input port, the other end to a power outlet.
- To connect the VGA/HDMI/DVI/DisplayPort cable:
 - Plug one end of the VGA/HDMI/DVI/DisplayPort cable to the monitor's VGA/HDMI/DVI/DisplayPort jack.
 - Connect the other end of the VGA/HDMI/DVI/DisplayPort cable to your computer's VGA/HDMI/DVI/DisplayPort jack.
 - c. Tighten the two screws to secure the VGA/DVI connector.
- To use the earphone: connect the end with plug type to the monitor's earphone jack when an HDMI or DisplayPort signal is fed.
- To use the USB ports: Plug the smaller end (type B) of the USB upstream
 cable to the monitor's USB upstream port, and the larger end (type A) to your
 computer's USB port. That will enable the USB ports and card reader on the
 monitor to work.



When these cables are connected, you can choose the desired signal from the Input Select item in the OSD menu.

2.4 Turning on the monitor

Press the power button \dot{O} . See page 1-2 for the location of the power button. The power indicator \dot{O} lights up in white to show that the monitor is ON.

3.1 OSD (On-Screen Display) menu

3.1.1 How to reconfigure



- Press the MENU button to activate the OSD menu.
- 3. Press \bigcirc / \bigcirc , and \bigcirc / \bigcirc to change the settings of the selected function.
- 4. To exit and save the OSD menu, press the **/ ■** button repeatedly until the OSD menu disappears. To adjust other functions, repeat steps 1-3.


1. Splendid

This function contains six sub-functions you can select for your preference. Each mode has the Reset selection, allowing you to maintain your setting or return to the preset mode.





2. Color

Set a desired color setting from this menu.



- **Brightness**: the adjusting range is from 0 to 100. ☼ /▲ is a hotkey to activate this function.
- Contrast: the adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
 ∫ ▼ is a hotkey to activate this function.
- **Saturation**: the adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Hue**: shifts the image color between green and purple.
- Color Temp.: contains 3 modes including 9300K, 6500K and 5000K.
- Gamma: allows you to set the color mode to 2.2 or 1.8.
- Advanced Setting:
 - * 6-axis Hue adjustment.



6-axis Saturation adjustment.



- * Adjusts the gain levels for R, G, B.
- Adjusts the black level offset values for R, G, B.

Color Reset:

- Current Splendid color mode reset:
 Resets the color settings of current color mode to the factory default value.
- * All Splendid color mode reset:
 Resets the color settings of all color modes to the factory default value.

3. Image

Set the image related setting from this menu.



- Sharpness: the adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Aspect Control: adjusts the aspect ratio to full, 4:3, 1:1, or OverScan (only available for the HDMI input).
- ASCR: turns on/off the ASCR (ASUS Smart Contrast Ratio) function.

- Position: adjusts the horizontal position (H-Position) and the vertical position (V-Position) of the image. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Focus: reduces Horizonal-line noise and Vertical-line noise of the image by adjusting (Phase) and (Clock) separately. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- AUTO Adjust.: Automatically adjusts the image to its optimized position, clock, and phase.



- Phase adjusts the phase of the pixel clock signal. With a wrong phase adjustment, the screen shows horizontal disturbances.
- Clock (pixel frequency) controls the number of pixels scanned by one horizontal sweep. If the frequency is not correct, the screen shows vertical stripes and the image is not proportional.

4. PIP/PBP Setting

The PIP/PBP Setting allows you to open up another sub-window connected from another video source besides the main-window from your original video source. By activating this function, you can have two pictures from two different video sources displayed by the monitor.



- PIP/PBP Mode: turns the PIP or PBP function on or off.
- PIP/PBP Source: Selects the video input source from among VGA, DVI, HDMI, and DisplayPort.
- Size: Adjusts the PIP size to Small, Middle, or Large. (Only available for the PIP mode)
- Position: Adjusts the position of the sub-window to Right-Top, Left-Top, Right-Bottom, or Left-Bottom. (Only available for the PIP mode)
- **Switch**: Switches the sources of the main and sub-windows.



The DVI and HDMI input sources should not be selected as the mainwindow or sub-window at the same time. See the table below for details.

5. Input Select

In this function, you can select your desired input source.



6. System Setup

Allows you to adjust the system.



- Splendid Demo Mode: splits the screen into two for Splendid modes comparison. (Scenery mode/theater mode only)
- OSD Setup:
 - * Adjusts the horizontal position (H-Position)/the vertical position (V-Position) of the OSD from 0 to 100.
 - * Adjusts the OSD timeout from 10 to 120 seconds.
 - * Enables or disables the DDC/CI function.
 - * Adjusts the OSD background from opaque to transparent.
- Information: shows the monitor information.
- Language: there are 10 languages for your selection, including English, French, German, Spanish, Italian, Dutch, Russian, Traditional Chinese, Simplified Chinese, and Japanese.
- Power Indicator: turns the power LED indicator on/off.
- All Reset: "Yes" allows you to restore the default settings.

3.3 Troubleshooting (FAQ)

Problem	Possible Solution
Power LED is not ON	 Press the button to check if the monitor is in the ON mode. Check if the power cord is properly connected to the monitor and the power outlet. Check if the power switch is ON.
The power LED lights amber and there is no screen image	Check if the monitor and the computer are in the ON mode. Make sure the signal cable is properly connected the monitor and the computer. Inspect the signal cable and make sure none of the pins are bent. Connect the computer with another available monitor to check if the computer is properly working.
Screen image is too light or dark	Adjust the Contrast and Brightness settings via OSD.
Screen image is not centered or sized properly	Press the ■ / ■ button for 2-4 seconds to automatically adjust the image (for VGA mode only). Adjust the H-Position or V-Position settings via OSD.
Screen image bounces or a wave pattern is present in the image	 Make sure the signal cable is properly connected to the monitor and the computer. Move electrical devices that may cause electrical interference.
Screen image has color defects (white does not look white)	 Inspect the signal cable and make sure that none of the pins are bent. Perform All Reset via OSD. Adjust the R/G/B color settings or select the Color Temperature via OSD.
Screen image is blurry or fuzzy	Press the ■ / ■ button for 2-4 seconds to automatically adjust the image (for VGA mode only). Adjust the Phase and Clock settings via OSD.
No sound or sound is low	 Ensure that the HDMI cable is properly connected to the monitor and the computer. Adjust the volume settings of both your monitor and HDMI device. Ensure that the computer sound card driver is properly installed and activated.
