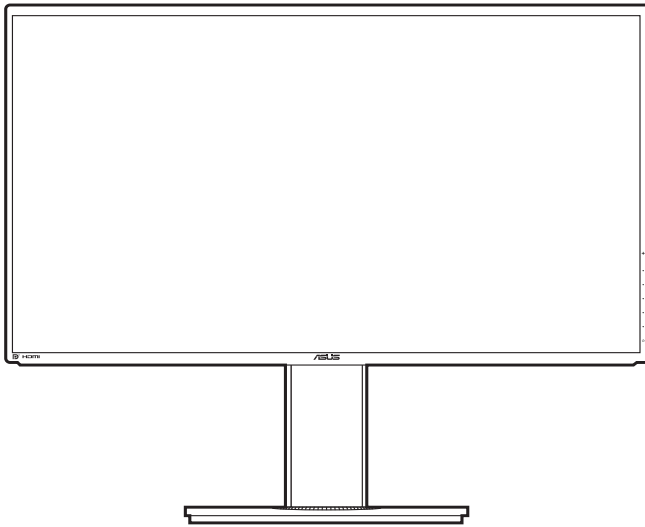

Care & Cleaning

- Before you lift or reposition your monitor, it is better to disconnect the cables and power cord. Follow the correct lifting techniques when positioning the monitor. When lifting or carrying the monitor, grasp the edges of the monitor. Do not lift the display by the stand or the cord.
- Cleaning. Turn your monitor off and unplug the power cord. Clean the monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Stubborn stains may be removed with a cloth dampened with mild cleaner.
- Avoid using a cleaner containing alcohol or acetone. Use a cleaner intended for use with the monitor. Never spray cleaner directly on the screen, as it may drip inside the monitor and cause an electric shock.

The following symptoms are normal with the monitor:

- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- When the same image is displayed for hours, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image. The screen will recover slowly or you can turn off the Power Switch for hours.
- When the screen becomes black or flashes, or cannot work anymore, contact your dealer or service center to fix it. Do not repair the screen by yourself!

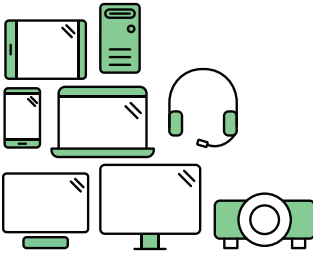

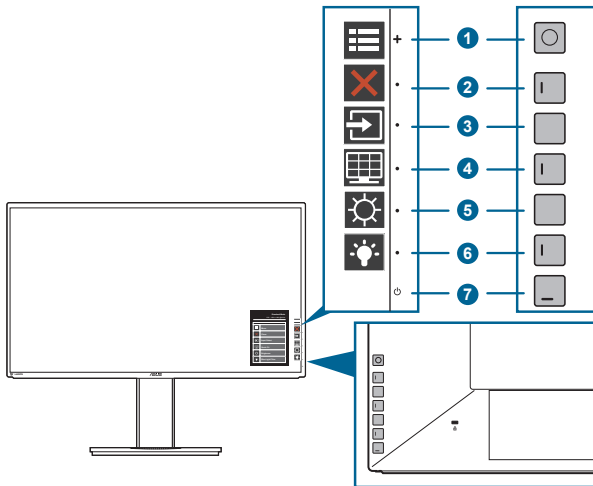

1.3 Monitor introduction



1.3.1 Front view




1.  Menu (5-way) button:
 - Press this button to enter the OSD menu.
 - Enacts the selected OSD menu items.
 - Increases/Decreases values or moves your selection up/down/left/right.
2.  Close button:
 - Exits the OSD menu.
 - Toggles the Key Lock function between on and off with a long press for 5 seconds.
3.  Input select button:
 - Selects an available input source.



Press  button (Input Select button) to display VGA, Dual-DVI, HDMI, or DisplayPort signals after you connect VGA/Dual-DVI/HDMI/DisplayPort cable with the monitor.

4.  QuickFit button:
 - This is a hotkey to activate the QuickFit function designed for alignment.
 - The QuickFit function contains 10 pages of common grid patterns, paper sizes, and photo sizes. (Please refer to 1.3.3 QuickFit Function).
5.  Shortcut **1**
 - Default: Brightness hotkey
 - To change the hotkey function, go to the Shortcut > Shortcut 1 menu.

6.  Shortcut 2

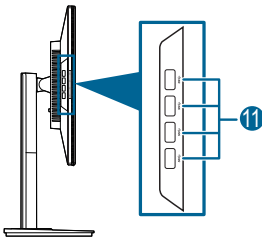
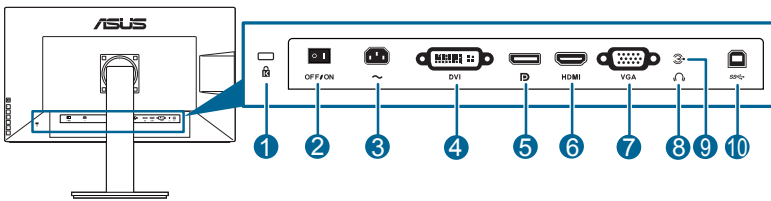
- Default: Blue light filter hotkey
- To change the hotkey function, go to the Shortcut > Shortcut 2 menu.

7.  Power button/power indicator

- Turns the monitor on/off.
- The color definition of the power indicator is as the below table.

Rear connectors


1. **Kensington lock slot.**
2. **Power switch.** Press the switch to turn on/off power.
3. **AC-IN port.** This port connects the power cord.
4. **DVI port.** This 24-pin port is for PC (Personal Computer) DVI-D digital signal connection.
5. **DisplayPort in.** This port is for connection with a DisplayPort compatible device.
6. **HDMI port.** This port is for connection with an HDMI compatible device.
7. **VGA port.** This 15-pin port is for PC VGA connection.

- 8. **Earphone jack.** This port is only available when an HDMI/DisplayPort cable is connected.
- 9. **Audio-in port.** This port connects PC audio source by the bundled audio cable.
- 10. **USB 3.0 upstream port.** This port is for connection with a USB upstream cable. The connection enables the USB ports on the monitor.
- 11. **USB 3.0 downstream ports.** These ports are for connection with USB devices, such as USB keyboard/mouse, USB flash drive, etc.






This monitor is Super-Speed USB 3.0 compatible.

1.3.3 QuickFit Function

The QuickFit function contains three kinds of patterns: (1) Grid patterns (2) Paper size (3) Photo size. To activate the patterns, press the QuickFit button. Use the  Menu (5-way) button to select a desired pattern. You can move the button up/down/left/right to change the pattern's position if needed. Note that all the patterns can be moved left/right according to your need, but may have limited range for moving up/down.






1. Grid patterns

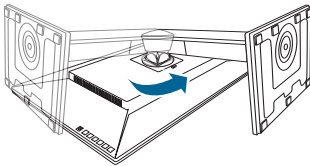
2.1 Detaching the arm/base (for VESA wall mount)

The detachable arm/base of this monitor is specially designed for VESA wall mount.

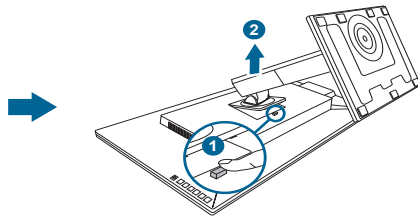
To detach the arm/base:

1. Have the front of the monitor face down on a table.
2. Press the release button, and then detach the arm/base from the monitor (Figure 2).

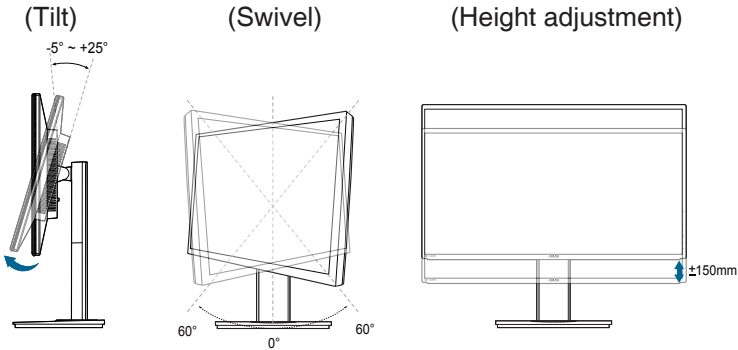
We recommend that you cover the table surface with soft cloth to prevent damage to the monitor.



- The VESA wall mount kit (100 x 100 mm) is purchased separately.
 - Use only the UL Listed Wall Mount Bracket with minimum weight/load 22.7kg (Screw size: M4 x 10 mm)

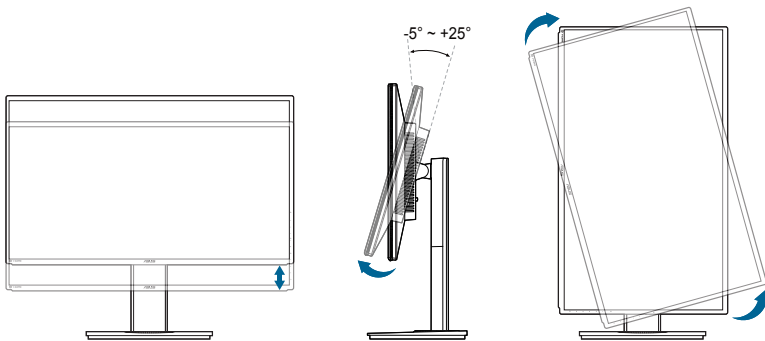
2.2 Adjusting the monitor

- For optimal viewing, we recommend that you look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.
- Hold the stand to prevent the monitor from falling when you change its angle.
- You can adjust the monitor's angle from +25° to -5°, and it allows 60° swivel adjustment from either left or right. You can also adjust the monitor's height within +/- 150 mm.



Pivoting the monitor

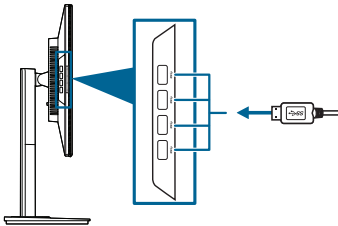
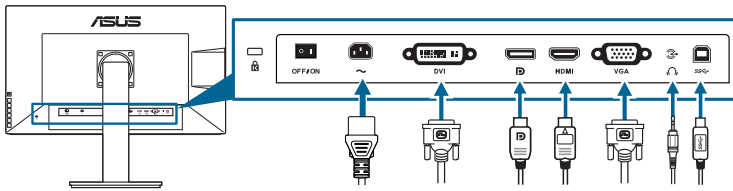
1. Lift the monitor to the highest position.
2. Tilt the monitor to its maximum angle.
3. Pivot the monitor clockwise to the angle you need.



It is normal that the monitor slightly shakes while you adjust the viewing angle.

2.3 Connecting the cables

Connect the cables as the following instructions:





- **To connect the power cord:** Connect one end of the power cord securely to the monitor's AC input port, the other end to a power outlet.
- **To connect the VGA/Dual-DVI/HDMI/DisplayPort cable:**
 - a. Plug one end of the VGA/Dual-DVI/HDMI/DisplayPort cable to the monitor's VGA/Dual-DVI/HDMI/DisplayPort jack.
 - b. Connect the other end of the VGA/Dual-DVI/HDMI/DisplayPort cable to your computer's VGA/Dual-DVI/HDMI/DisplayPort jack.
 - c. Tighten the two screws to secure the VGA/Dual-DVI connector.
- **To connect the audio cable:** connect one end of the audio cable to the monitor's Audio-in port, the other end to the computer's audio-out port.
- **To use the earphone:** connect the end with plug type to the monitor's earphone jack when an HDMI or DisplayPort signal is fed.
- **To use the USB 3.0 ports:** Take the supplied USB 3.0 cable, and plug the smaller end (type B) of the USB upstream cable to the monitor's USB upstream port, and the larger end (type A) to your computer's USB 3.0 port. Make sure your computer is installed with the latest Windows 7/Windows 8 operating system. That will enable the USB ports on the monitor to work.



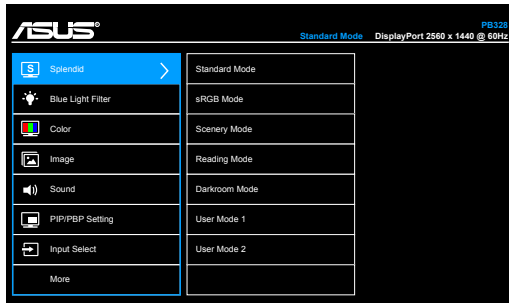
When these cables are connected, you can choose the desired signal from the Input Select item in the OSD menu.










2.4 Turning on the monitor

Press the power button . See page 1-2 for the location of the power button. The power indicator  lights up in white to show that the monitor is ON.

3.1 OSD (On-Screen Display) menu

3.1.1 How to reconfigure

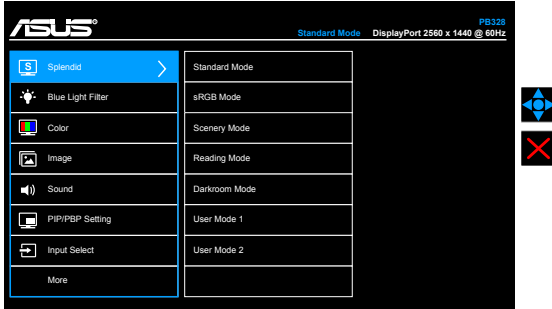


1. Press the  Menu (5-way) button to activate the OSD menu.
2. Move the  Menu (5-way) button up/down/left/right to navigate through the functions. Highlight the desired function and press the  Menu (5-way) button to activate it. If the function selected has a sub-menu, move the  Menu (5-way) button up/down to navigate through the sub-menu functions. Highlight the desired sub-menu function and press the  Menu (5-way) button or move the  Menu (5-way) button to activate it.
3. Move the  Menu (5-way) button up/down to change the settings of the selected function.
4. To exit and save the OSD menu, press the  button or move the  Menu (5-way) button left repeatedly until the OSD menu disappears. To adjust other functions, repeat steps 1-3.

3.1.2 OSD function introduction

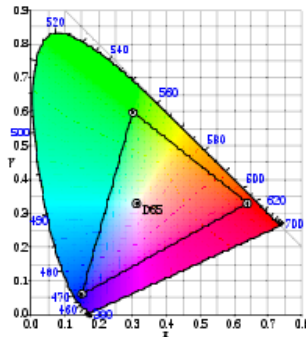
1. Splendid

This function contains 7 sub-functions you can select for your preference. Each mode has the Reset selection, allowing you to maintain your setting or return to the preset mode.



- **Standard Mode:** Best choice for document editing with SplendidPlus Video Enhancement.
- **sRGB Mode:** Compatible with sRGB color space, sRGB mode is the best choice for document editing.

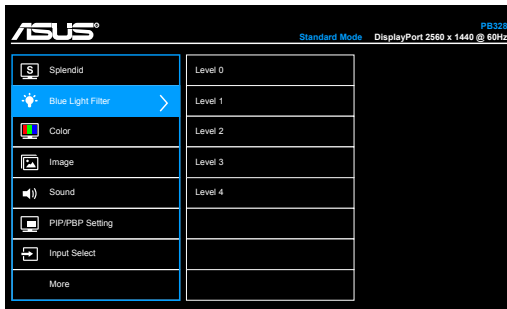
- **Scenery Mode:** Best choice for scenery photo display with SplendidPlus Video Enhancement.
- **Reading Mode:** This is the best choice for book reading.
- **Darkroom Mode:** This is the best choice for a weak ambient light environment.

2. Blue Light Filter

In this function, you can adjust the blue light filter level.



- **Level 0:** No change.
- **Level 1~4:** The higher the level, the less blue light is scattered. When Blue Light Filter is activated, the default settings of Standard Mode will be automatically imported. Between Level 1 to Level 3, the Brightness function is user-configurable. Level 4 is optimized setting. It is compliance with TUV Low Blue Light Certification. The Brightness function is not user-configurable.

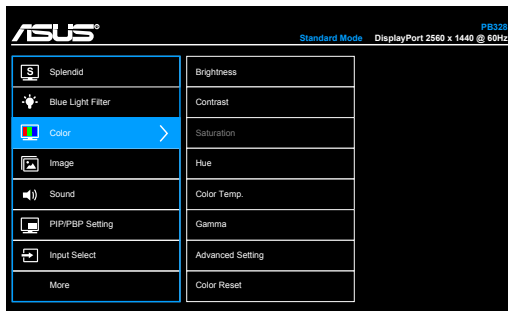


Please refer to the following to alleviate eye strains:

- Users should take some time away from the display if working for long hours. It is advised to take short breaks (at least 5 mins) after around 1 hour of continuous working at the computer. Taking short and frequent breaks is more effective than a single longer break.
- To minimize eye strain and dryness in your eyes, users should rest the eye periodically by focusing on objects that are far away.
- Eye exercises can help to reduce eye strain. Repeat these exercises often. If eye strain continues please consult a physician. Eye exercises: (1) Repeating look up and down (2) Slowly roll your eyes (3) Move your eyes diagonal.
- High energy blue light may lead to eye strain and AMD (Age-Related Macular Degeneration). Blue light Filter to reduce 70% (max.) harmful blue light to avoiding CVS (Computer Vision Syndrome).

3. Color

Set a desired color setting from this menu.

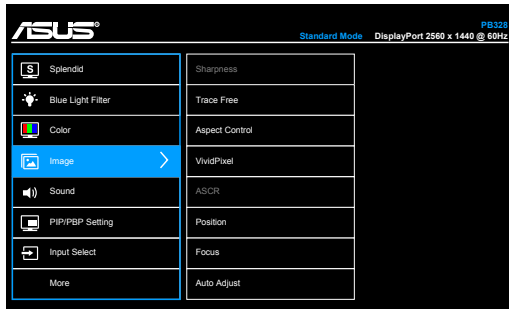


- **Brightness:** The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Contrast:** The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Saturation:** The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Hue:** Shifts the image color between green and purple.
- **Color Temp.:** Contains 4 modes including 9300K, 6500K, 5500K and 5000K.
- **Gamma:** Allows you to set the color mode to 2.4, 2.2, 2.0 or 1.8.
- **Advanced Setting:**
 - * 6-axis Hue adjustment.
 - * 6-axis Saturation adjustment.
 - * Adjusts the gain levels for R, G, B.
 - * Adjusts the black level offset values for R, G, B.
- **Color Reset:**

- * **Current Splendid color mode reset:**
Resets the color settings of current color mode to the factory default value.
- * **All Splendid color mode reset:**
Resets the color settings of all color modes to the factory default value.

4. Image

Set the image related setting from this menu.



- **Sharpness:** The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Trace Free:** Adjusts the response time of the monitor.
- **Aspect Control:** Adjusts the aspect ratio to full, 4:3, 1:1 or OverScan.



4:3 is only available when input source is in 4:3 format. OverScan is only available for the HDMI input source.

- **VividPixel:** Enhances the outline of the displayed picture and generates high-quality images on screen.
- **ASCR:** Turns on/off the ASCR (ASUS Smart Contrast Ratio) function.
- **Position (Only available for VGA input):** adjusts the horizontal position (H-Position) and the vertical position (V-Position) of the image. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Focus (Only available for VGA input):** reduces Horizontal-line noise and Vertical-line noise of the image by adjusting (Phase) and (Clock) separately. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.



- Phase adjusts the phase of the pixel clock signal. With a wrong phase adjustment, the screen shows horizontal disturbances.
- Clock (pixel frequency) controls the number of pixels scanned by one horizontal sweep. If the frequency is not correct, the screen shows vertical stripes and the image is not proportional.
- **Auto Adjust.:** Automatically adjusts the image to its optimized position, clock, and phase (for VGA mode only).

5. Sound

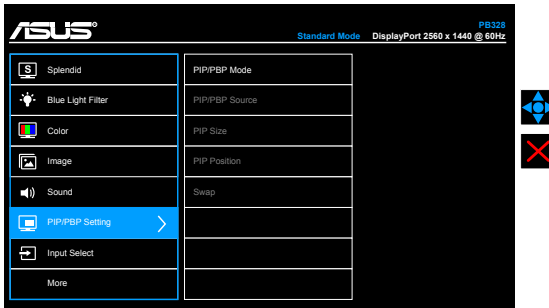
You can adjust Volume, Mute and Source from this menu.



- **Volume:** the adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Mute:** toggles the monitor sound between on and off.
- **Source:** decides the monitor sound comes from which source.

6. PIP/PBP Setting

The PIP/PBP Setting allows you to open up another sub-window connected from another video source besides the main-window from your original video source. By activating this function, you can have two pictures from two different video sources displayed by the monitor.

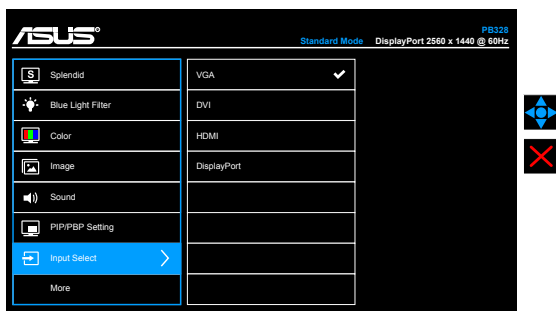


- **PIP/PBP Mode:** Turns the PIP or PBP function on or off.
- **PIP/PBP Source:** Selects the video input source from among VGA, DVI, HDMI and DisplayPort.
- **PIP Size:** Adjusts the PIP size to Small, Middle, or Large. (Only available for the PIP mode)
- **PIP Position:** Adjusts the position of the sub-window to Right-Top, Left-Top, Right-Bottom, or Left-Bottom. (Only available for the PIP mode)
- **SWAP:** Switches the sources of the main and sub-windows.

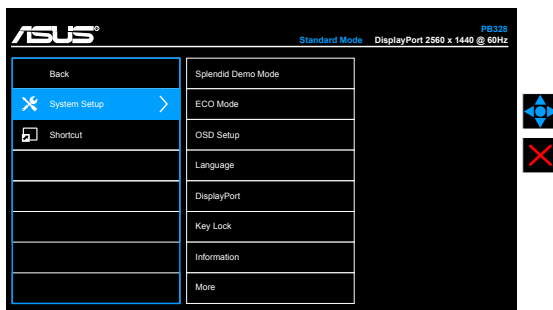
7. Input Select

In this function, you can select your desired input source.



8. System Setup

Allows you to adjust the system.

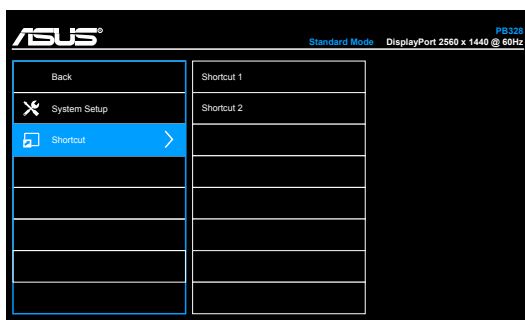


- **Splendid Demo Mode:** Splits the screen into two for Splendid modes comparison. (Scenery mode only)
- **ECO Mode:** reduces power consumption.
- **OSD Setup:**
 - * Adjusts the OSD timeout from 10 to 120 seconds.
 - * Enables or disables the DDC/CI function.
 - * Adjusts the OSD background from opaque to transparent.

- * Adjusts the OSD rotation.
- **Language:** There are 21 languages for your selection, including English, French, German, Italian, Spanish, Dutch, Portuguese, Russian, Czech, Croatian, Polish, Romanian, Hungarian, Turkish, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Thai, Indonesian, Persian.
- **DisplayPort:** Selects DP 1.1 or DP 1.2.
- **Keylock:** To disable all function keys. Press the second button from the top over five seconds to cancel the key lock function.
- **Information:** Shows the monitor information.
- **Power Indicator:** Turns the power LED indicator on/off.
- **All Reset:** “Yes” allows you to restore the default settings.

9. Shortcut

Defines the functions for Shortcut 1 and 2 buttons.



- **Shortcut 1/Shortcut 2:** selects a function for Shortcut 1 and 2 buttons.



When a certain function is selected or activated, your shortcut key may not support. Available function choices for shortcut: Brightness, Auto Adjust, Contrast, PIP/PBP Setting, Color Temp., Volume, User Mode 1, User Mode 2.
